Horse Racing 101: "Hats, Bets & Juleps"

4 Days May 27-30, 2020



Day 1 – Today, you travel to Louisville, KY. On arrival, you check into the Drury Inn for a three night stay. Dinner is on your own this evening, but you can take advantage of the hotel's 5:30 Kickback with a rotating menu of hot food and cold beverages.

Day 2 - Enjoy the hotel's breakfast before touring the Louisville Slugger Museum. You don't have to be a baseball fan to love Louisville Slugger Museum & Factory. It's iconic, it's linked to legends and it is one of Louisville's best known tourist attractions. This tour is fascinating with interactive exhibits that are fun. Baseball is such a big part of American history and culture that even if you don't think you're fan, you will still find a connection here.



Then you visit Hermitage Farms, a world-class equine operation where champion thoroughbreds are born and nursed. You will see next year's babies at the age of 4 or 5 months. These soon to be racehorses will just be learning to run. Your guide will talk about them and about the Farm's past babies that grew into champions including winners of the Kentucky Derby, Kentucky Oaks, Breeders' Cup and more than 200 other stakes races.

The afternoon features The Evan Williams Bourbon Experience, an artisanal distillery with a guided historical tour. Celebrating the legacy of Evan Williams, Kentucky's first distiller, this immersive experience brings to life the history and tradition of Kentucky's native spirit. A Mint Julep demonstration is included in your visit. Mint Juleps are the quintessential Kentucky Derby Drink. A Southern Style Dinner is included this evening in the Evan Williams Speakeasy.

Day 3 – After breakfast, begin your day at The Kentucky Derby Museum located at Churchill Downs. Here they celebrate the tradition, history, hospitality and pride of the world-renown event that is the Kentucky. Your education takes on a serious "Hatitude", with a class on how to make your own "Derby Hat". You will discover that The Kentucky Derby is as much about watching people as it horses, every woman accessorizes with stylish hats. You will also enjoy a seminar titles "Horse Talk", where you will learn the secrets of picking a winner.

Once school's out at the Museum, you will be escorted over to your seats at Churchill Downs Racetrack for a thrilling afternoon of live racing. Admission, seating on Millionaires Row or Skye Terrace, Chef's Buffet and a Race Day Program is included today. Dining room service here comes with scenic vantage points from a tiered balcony overlooking the finish line. You also will receive ten (10) free \$2.00 bets for you afternoon of racing.

This evening, enjoy a dinner cruise and sightseeing on the Mary M. Miller or the Belle of Louisville (whichever is sailing on this date). With that big red paddlewheel kicking up a whitewater feather trail, you cruise on the mighty Ohio River. The Mary M. Miller was named after Louisvillian Mary Millicent Miller, who also happened to be the first woman to ever attain her steamboat captain's license way back in 1884.

Day 4 - Enjoy the hotel's breakfast before departing for home.
